Jailers/Supervisors	Investigating Allegations of Staff Sexual Misconduct with Offenders Since the passage of PREA in 2003, there has been increased national and international attention to the issue of sexual abuse of individuals in custody. Kentucky, as well as other states have strengthened criminal laws prohibiting the sexual abuse of individuals in custody. Reports on staff sexual misconduct have increased in number; non-governmental organizations such as Human Rights Watch, Amnesty International and Stop Prisoner Rape have documented the issue, and both print and visual media have covered sexual violence in correctional settings. This class will look at the steps being taken in dealing with the “Code of Silence” surrounding staff sexual misconduct with offenders. We will discuss not only what to look for but also how to address when we find “it”, what we must do to eliminate as well as preventing staff sexual misconduct under custodial supervision.	Collins
